Doyle to Rally Supporters Upon Hitting 500 Individual Donors

Campaign Celebrates Strong Infrastructure & Grassroots Support, Plans To Present Choice Bronx Democrats Face In September



Bronx, New York- John Doyle, likely Democratic candidate for New York City Council in the 13th District, plans to rally supporters in his hometown of City Island this evening after hitting 500 individual donations. This figure blows away his nearest competitors, and is even more impressive as 90% of Doyle's donors come from within New York City itself, and 70% come from the district he seeks to represent. Furthermore, Doyle leads in individual donors in virtually every zip code and neighborhood within the district, while his main opponent, Albany Assemblyman Mark Gjonaj, receives most of his money from outside of the City itself.

"From Allerton to Throggs Neck, our campaign continues to show momentum because we are focused on returning power to our community, away from City Hall and Albany and instead back to the people themselves," said Doyle. "The support we've seen in this campaign is beyond my wildest expectations. People from every neighborhood have stood up and demanded change. I hear their voices, I see their faces, and I know our neighborhood is worth fighting for!"


Tonight at 7pm, Doyle will be on hand to kick off his sixth campaign fundraiser at a new business in the community, Grindstone Property Group. Too many empty storefronts of our district lie empty, and with this fundraiser, much like his campaign, Doyle wants to celebrate and champion new ideas and business models that restore and improve our communities.

Thus far, Doyle has raised nearly \$70,000 without throwing a single fundraiser outside of the

Borough of the Bronx.

“While I respect all of my opponents, you really have to wonder why so many people from outside of our district have contributed so much to their campaigns.” he explained. “Clearly they are not giving for philanthropic purposes, they’re giving because they have interests in this district and in this city they expect to be addressed. We need to change this culture that allows corruption to flourish. My campaign is built on putting our residents, our neighborhoods, and our families first.”

Doyle expects to qualify for the ballot and face-off against other candidates in the Democratic primary, which will be held on September 12th 2017. His campaign was recognized last year and this year as being a city-wide leader in small-dollar donations and his campaign has been profiled by NY1, WCBS and Bronx Voice.
